



What will be the impact of COVID-19 on public support for development?


Increase

- Major public health issue
- Global in nature
- Most detrimental impacts on developing countries
- Need for cooperation to protect Canadians


Decrease

- Large public sector deficit
- Loss of personal income
- Major challenges in Canada
- Complexity and need for protection drives swing towards isolationism


Looking to the future, how do you think the amount that Canada spends on development aid/health-related development aid to developing countries should change?



Global health issues that should be prioritized in Canadian aid to developing countries




Thinking about issues occurring around the world, to what extent if at all, are you concerned about the following?"

Preventing the spread of infectious disease as a reason to increase Canadian ODA






"I see myself more as a global citizen than as a Canadian"



Support for increases in Canadian aid spending by value positioning




Positionality on Canada and its role in the world




