Did you know? 12.42% of Canadian aid goes to global health spending, making it the second largest area of Canadian aid spending.

For every dollar invested in vaccines, there is an expected benefit of around USD \$16 for national economies. The next year holds incredible opportunities for impact in immunization as the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance will be looking to Canada for financial support. Over the last 20 years both of these organizations have been on the front lines of the fight against vaccine-preventable diseases, ultimately saving the lives of millions of children. Tuberculosis (TB) is a curable and preventable disease that claimed 1.6 million lives in 2016. That is more than HIV/AIDS, malaria and Ebola combined. Progress in the fight against this ancient disease is stagnant. We desperately need global political commitment and increased investments at the highest level. TB not only affects people abroad but it impacts the lives of Canadians as well.

The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria

On August 22, 2019 the Canadian Government announced that it would increase its investment of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria by 15.7% to a total of

CAD\$930.4 million over three years (2020–2022). It is an investment that will contribute to 16 million lives saved and is a testament to Canada’s continued leadership in global health.

Announcement at G20 in Osaka, Japan

On June 29, 2019 at the G20 summit in Osaka Japan, **Prime Minister Hon. Justin Trudeau** announced an additional CAD\$150 million in new funding for the Global Financing Facility for Women, Children and Adolescents (GFF).

Thank you Prime Minister Trudeau for this new multi-year funding commitment to the GFF Trust Fund for the period 2020-2022, in addition to the CAD\$50 million in funds announced at the GFF Replenishment in November 2018. The GFF is a multi-stakeholder partnership that is helping countries tackle the greatest health and nutrition issues affecting women, children and adolescents.



Investing in Education at G7 Paris, France

At the G7 development ministerial meetings in Paris, France, Canada's former Minister of International Development and Minister for Women and Gender Equality, **Hon. Maryam Monsef**, announced Canada's support of 25 new projects - predominantly in sub-Saharan Africa - to improve access to education for women and girls. Our sincerest thank you to Hon. Maryam Monsef for working together with partners to ensure that women and girls around the world are given equal access to quality education, thus supporting their empowerment, learning, and protection.

Canadian Aid Increases in 2019 Federal Budget

A very special thank you to the Standing Committee on Finance for recommendation 99 in the Pre-Budget 2019 report stating Canada will “increase its official development assistance with the goal of allocating 0.7% of gross national income to the International Assistance Envelope by 2030, with three-year rolling targets, and in allocating this assistance, target food security, improved nutrition, and inclusive and high-quality education, particularly for girls and young women. We personally thank MPs **Hon. Wayne Easter, Hon. Pierre Pollievre, Rachel Bendayan, Peter Fragiskatos, Tom Kmiec, Michael V. McLeod, Blake Richards, and Francesco Sorbara** for your support of those living in poverty around the world.

Thank you to the Finance Minister, **Hon. Bill Morneau** for an additional CAD\$2.7 billion to the International Assistance Envelope (IAE) until 2024.


