COMMUNITY-BASED AGENTS

Community-Based Agents (CBAs) make the project successful by conducting the community education sessions and making the door-to-door visits to bring education, awareness and treatment to their communities. The CBAs often go above and beyond their roles, sometimes transporting children to the nearest health centres (5-10 km away) on their bicycles to ensure the child sees a doctor if needed, making them the true heroes of this project.
