Strengthening Health Outcomes for Women and Children (SHOW)



Project Purpose

To contribute to the reduction of maternal and child mortality among marginalized and vulnerable women, specifically adolescent girls, and their children in 7 regions across Senegal

Designed to Achieve

To improve the utilization and delivery of quality sexual, reproductive, maternal and newborn health services through community sensitization, health management data collection and domestic public engagement.



Worked across **210** health facilities and trained **over 1000** health personnel and community health workers

660,000 participants reached, including including over 68,000 adolescent girls aged 15-19



Proportion of women of reproductive age who received assistance from a skilled health personnel during their most recent pregnancy **increased from 76% to 96%**
